General Data Protection Regulation

Important changes are coming with the introduction of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

Data protection may not be the most exciting of topics but it is important for running our charity ethically and responsibly. Being transparent and open about how we process people's data can help us maintain the trust of our supporters, protect our wider reputation and to help attract new relationships.

It's essential we are all aware of the GDPR and the changes that it introduces. The GDPR represents an evolution in data protection law, strengthening individuals' rights within the EU.

The law comes into force on Friday 25 May 2018 and we are making preparations now in order to be compliant with the new legislation.



Quality Assurance

Character Appraisals for dogs in socialising



Following the successful recruitment of our new Quality Assessors, Steve Penman and Lotte Stringer, we are happy to say we are restarting Character Appraisals in February 2018. For those of you who have had dogs in socialising before you will recall that we used to do this assessment at 8 months, however after gathering your feedback and reflecting on the needs of the Charity, we will now be completing the assessment at 10 months of age. The assessments will be carried out mainly at The Grange or The Beatrice Wright Centre, depending on your location. We hope this is a great opportunity for those of you who don't have puppy classes on site to visit the training centre and have a short tour. For those who live further afield, a QA Assessor will visit you at home.

The aim of the character appraisal is to gather information to ensure that he or she can be matched to the right applicant and that the dog's training from that point on can be tailored to the Recipient's individual need.

The format will involve one of our QA Assessors taking you and your dog into town where you will walk on lead, practice recall and have a settle in a café (please take this opportunity for a well-earned tea and cake!). Back on site we will take the dog away for a short period to see how he or she copes with a new handler.

Invitation letters will be sent out 4-6 weeks in advance with the details of when and where your dog's Character Appraisal will be and more information about the day. If you have any queries or questions about the character appraisal, please contact Karen Long

Welfare

Dog harnesses

Please remember to always remove your puppy or dog's harness when allowing he or she to free run unless otherwise instructed.

Our comfort harnesses and 'easy-walk' harnesses are restrictive to dogs' movements when doing anything other than a slow and steady walk. When running this can, over time, cause joint and muscle problems. If you've been provided with a harness for specific training purposes, please check with your trainer.



Puppy growth charts

Hearing Dogs have been working with The University of Liverpool and Walthams (centre for pet nutrition) to create the first ever puppy growth charts in the UK. They have been scientifically developed in a similar manner to charts used to monitor the growth of children which are used by healthcare professionals around the world. Puppy Growth Charts are a user-friendly clinical tool designed for to monitor dog growth.

Growth chart assessment will help determine if a puppy is following the expected growth pattern and may aid early identification of any potential nutritional or health problems. By weighing and capturing regular data, we can see if a puppy is growing at a healthy rate and act quickly should a concern develops.

All puppies will now have a copy of their growth chart in their medical record book. If you have any questions please contact your trainer. You can also find out more on Walthams website.
